The campaign theme for 2010-2011 is: **URBAN RISK REDUCTION: BUILDING RESILIENT CITIES, ADDRESSING URBAN DISASTER RISK.**

Cities and local governments need to get ready and become resilient to disasters. For the next two years and beyond, the United Nations International Strategy for Disaster Reduction (UNISDR) will campaign together with its partners for this to happen.
